The little twisted handle has been evidently for a cup or other small wooden vessel, and has two holes on the flattened end to receive little pins or nails. A small stone celt and iron axe-head of ordinary pattern were also found. But the most interesting relic is the remains of a smelting-pot, made of a composition of lime and bone ashes. A drawing is here given to one-eighth of. natural size to show the form of this crucible. There is a heavy foot-stalk, 5 inches thick and 4 inches high, supporting a bowl 4 inches deep, shaped like a modern champagne-glass. The rim measures 13 inches across, and is half an inch thick at the top, with a lip for pouring out the metal. Some bronze slag still remains in the bottom of the bowl. Goldsmiths crucibles are today made of bone ashes. The...
