Nothing has since been developed in the graphic method which carries the art beyond his development of it. I recall a talk of his/at the Cosmos Club many years ago, in which he lined the walls with colored drafts of the various symbols he employed, in an endless variety of combinations, suitable for any association of related data, and described the particular advantage of each in particular instances.
