

As originally described, the ground colonr is uniform brown, each scale with a white (pale blue) spot. In a second and smaller example, since forwarded by Mrs. Nichols, the ground colour is pale brown with darker markings disposed as follows: --The fore part of the head is dark and an irregular bar passes from behind the eye to above the opercle and a broader one from beneath the eye obliquely backwards across the angle of the opercle, where a few irregular blotches also occur. The lower Dart of the head is dark, with three large white spots along each ramus of the lower jaw. The body bears five bars directed obliquely forward, the first immediately in front of the dorsal fin; this unites with the post-ocular band and is preceded by two large blotches on the occipital region. The second body band arises at the base of the iv-vi dorsal spines, passes behind the opercle and broadens below, there uniting with the third band which originates at the base of the last three dorsal spines. The next band is less regular, arises beneath the middle of the soft dorsal and ventrally extends from the vent to the end of the anal: the last band is across the caudal peduncle. The lower surface of the fish is generally dark coloured (owing to the width of the bands) the chest especially; there is a large black spot on the isthmus, preceded...
