This recommendation was based on evidence synthesized for the 2000 Public Health Service (PHS) Clinical Practice Guideline on Treating Tobacco Use and Dependence. The PHS report focused specifically on tobacco-use treatment, including a review of the effectiveness of tobacco-use interventions for adolescent smokers. In contrast, the current systematic review examines the benefits and harms of strategies designed to reduce the prevalence of tobacco use through primary care relevant prevention and cessation interventions in children and adolescents. The USPSTF will use this review to update its 2003 recommendation. Most tobacco users in the United States are cigarette smokers. As a result, the majority of research in this field has focused on the assessment, prevention, and treatment of cigarette smoking.
