Neil Richardson - archaeologist, Semitic-language scholar, teacher, and ordained minister - taught for 24 years as Professor of Old Testament at Boston University School of Theology and Graduate School. A life-long fascination with archaeology began when he participated in excavations at Dhiban in Moab and with Kathleen Kenyon at Jericho (Tell es-Sultan). He served as director of the W. F. Albright Institute of Archaeological Research and participated in excavations at Tell el-Jib (Gibeon), Beth-zur, Khirbet Fahil (Pella), Tell Balatah (Shechem), Tell Gezer, and Tell Dor. He loved to travel. In addition to his love of archaeology, Prof. Richardson's teaching was combined with an enjoyment of and care for his students. His students remember him as demanding, but warm and caring, and he gladly shared his knowledge of the ancient Middle Eastern world with students, academic colleagues, and groups of clergy and laity. The essays in this volume are offered in memory of Prof. Richardson and are grouped under three categories, reflecting his interests: The Hebrew Bible in Its Time, Archaeology and the Bible, and the Hebrew Bible and Its Later Uses.
