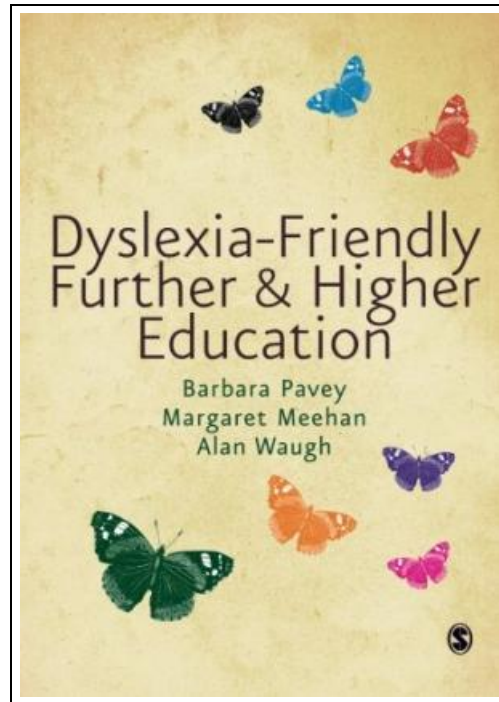

Looking at how dyslexia impacts on learning, the authors suggest ways to improve the learning environment and explain how to help students develop the basic skills that will help them to make the transition from study to employment. Building on the latest research and understanding of dyslexia, they also consider overlapping characteristics, emotional and social issues and funding. The book includes: visual chapter summaries; case studies drawn from practice; ideas for dyslexia-friendly written work, and lab and bench work; international perspectives; a selection of resources; and, model lesson plans and useful checklists.
