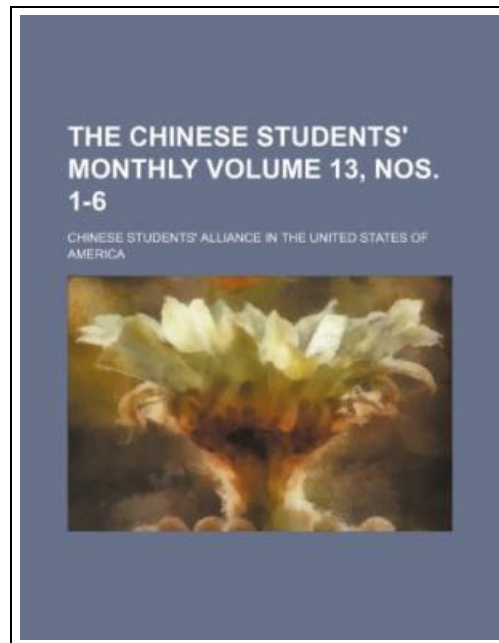

J. Chuan, and Mr. I. H. Si, who has started for France to work among the Chinese laborers in French munition plants. The number of students at the banquet was seventy-seven. Homin L. Lin. Dartmouth With the coming of Ming Lu, a Tsing Hua student who came across the ocean this year, there are now altogether four Chinese students in this institution. On account of the small number, no plan of a club has yet been formed. K. W. Chen and T. C. Lo, both 1918, are in the Tuck School of Business, studying commercial science; H. Huang, 1918, Philosophy and Education; M. Lu, 1918, English. H. Huang....
